Report from our Area Delegate

To My Dear Area 24 Al-Anon Members,

It is my privilege to serve you as your new Area Delegate. We have an amazing Area and I am looking forward to embracing what our Higher Power unfolds for us in the next three years.

This year I was honored to attend the 2018 World Service Conference on behalf of Area 24. The Conference was held in West Harrison, New York and marked eight years since the full Conference has returned to Stepping Stones. While Stepping Stones was the personal home of Bill and Lois W., it also served as the initial location of the Clearing House. It was from Stepping Stones in May of 1951 that 49 family groups moved forward in selecting the name of Al-Anon Family Groups. Lois and Ann compiled Al-Anon's first pieces of literature, pamphlets called <u>Purposes and Suggestions</u> and <u>One Wife's Story</u>, and within eight months Ann and Lois moved The Clearing House to the Old 24th Street Clubhouse in New York City. With help of volunteers, they registered 200 groups. All of this was accomplished without computers and smart phones. Upon returning from our visit to Stepping Stones, we were given the opportunity to share personal reflections. The comments expressed were filled with the overwhelming evidence that Lois and Anne B. were envisioned thinkers, committed to reaching families and

friends of alcoholics. Personal reflections included the gratitude for the opportunity to visit, expressed hope that the Conference as a whole will continue the practice of returning, gratitude for the work of our founders, as well as the overwhelming feeling that our Higher Power was and remains at work within the grounds of Stepping Stones.

The Spirit of Lois's message to the 1973 Conference--"Don't let the seriousness of your task stand in the way of your enjoying each other's companionship and the fun of working and planning together" -- was infused into the 2018 WSC Conference with the introduction of the newly revised Conference App. This year's Conference App included a new social media platform that gave conference members the opportunity to interact with each other as they would on other social media platforms, while protecting anonymity by ensuring comments and photos remained in the App itself. Excitement and use of the App increased once users discovered the "gaming" feature which assigned points based on postings, shares, likes and photos. The App was a daily reminder of this year's Conference theme, Al-Anon—There is no standing still!

For many years, the WSC has been using a spiritually based approach to discuss topics and to more effectively communicate information to the membership. The week was characterized by the joy of service and the application of Spiritual principles. I am so grateful to Area 24 for our continued commitment to be the active voice and effective group conscience of the MD/DC area. Let this be our primary purpose and as we move forward let there be no standing still.

Total income for the first quarter of 2018 was \$7,711, which included \$3,000 in excess funds which were transferred from the Fall Convention account.

Total program and administrative expenses for the first quarter were \$3,528.

The main expense for the quarter was \$1,975 supporting the attendance at the Northeast Regional Delegates Conference of our new and 3 of our past delegates.

We paid \$250 for a Legal Review of Alateen Safety Requirements and a \$304 premium for the crime and theft insurance, both of which occur every three years.

Cash Balances for AFG of MD and DC Inc., at March 31, 2018 are Operating Account at \$18,391 and Reserve Account at \$14,313.

The Spring Convention and Fall Convention bank balances on March 31, 2018, were \$8,332 and \$3,909, respectively

However, we are starting a new T-shirt committee. We are looking for someone to handle T-shirts for the volunteers, including design and purchase.

Volunteer training date is May 5, 10- noon, at the convention center. This is our second choice date, but this is the date WSO selected. We want to get the word out. If you cannot come to the training session, you can still volunteer. It will be helpful to attend. We don't know yet when the volunteer assignments will be posted. Jack, Chair of Greeters Subcommittee, will give a report at the Spring Assembly.

We have about 200 volunteers, but we need 200 more. Volunteering link: There is a link to a tinyurl and WSO is initiating a link. The host committee is responsibility for the volunteers for greeters. The WSO is responsible for volunteers to lead a workshop.

If you already signed-up, there is no need to sign up again. You are only signing up for about an hour time slot. You don't have to sign up for all day. This would be for greeters at BWI, train station, or the convention center.

Lisa RE will be handling "love mementos" or gifts for attendees. She has created a flier about them. (The question came up about commercial endorsement of Baltimore items, like Old Bay, the Baltimore Orioles, and other products associated with Baltimore. This may be what the Chamber of Commerce would recommend as symbols, but as Al-Anon we do not endorse outside enterprises. Please make note of that when using imagery.)

Spring Convention 2018 Update - Chair, Charles L.

The Convention will be held June 8-10 at Washington College, Chestertown, MD. They did the walk-through last weekend. Kent Hall has been newly renovated. There will be a live band for the dance.

26 people already registered. You can get linens through the college, or bring your own.

The theme is Hunting Al-Anon Treasures. Workshop names are very clever.

Fall Convention 2018 Update - Fall Convention treasurer, Charles L., reported

Yes, we are having a fall convention. They were able to lower the minimum number of room nights so we don't have as big a commitment as previous years (in light of the International Convention). This is in the same hotel as 2017, still a Delta Hotel, Nov. 2-4, 2018.

AA Spring Convention 2018 Update – Liaison, Jeff J.

He is super excited about this AA Convention with Al-Anon participation, June 29-July 1, 2018, at the Clarion Hotel in Frederick. It is important that Al-Anon have a presence at the convention. A loved one may come with the AA member and might not know about Al-Anon, and there are many dual members.

There will be 2 combined AA/Al-anon workshops and 2 separate Al-Anon meetings.

An Al-Anon speaker is on schedule for Saturday morning. Jeff could use some help with workshop ideas. There is a double-winners' workshop on Saturday 2:30.

Contact information: 240-505-1394. There is a flier out in the mail to previous Al-Anon attendees. Budget-\$500 - What does that cover? We decided years ago that the budge can't pay for someone's registration.

Can we announce this in the Al-Anon-cer? As long as it says Al-Anon participation.

It's on Area 24's website as a downloadable flyer.

DR Reports:

District 2: Frederick and surrounding- Glen

We have a Spanish-speaking meeting in the district. The district meets once a month and had to change locations. Because the district is sprawling and some people would have to come from a long distance (like Washington Co.), GRs can now call in to the district meeting. Cell phones are in the center of table. There is a workshop coming up: AA workshop with Al-Anon participation, Sat. March 31, called The Family Afterwards. It's on the Area website.

Outreach opportunity tomorrow- not an Al-Anon event. How do we do outreach at non-Al-Anon events, without promoting the event?

- People shared their experience in outreach at non-Al-Anon events. Have a table at the event.
- Don't send the outside event flier. Reshape the message to ask for volunteers.
- There is downloadable information about outreach on the WSO website and literature order form.

District 5: Harford County, Cecil County, and NE part of Baltimore County-Gail

There are 16 active groups in Harford and Cecil County. 2 are struggling. They are planning for a fall workshop October 27th.

District 6: North and NW Baltimore Co.- Ed

The February half-day workshop was well attended. The church on Deerco Rd. was a good location. They may consider a full day workshop with lunch for next year. He asked about what is a good prudent reserve.

District 7: Central Baltimore City-Lucinda

There are 9 active meetings, some with standing room only. There will be no Serenitea event this year, but they are planning for March of 2019. They have established regular meetings with four business meetings a year. They are trying to get more people involved in service. The district treasurer was really active in contacting all group treasurers, and keeping them informed about who the incoming treasurer is and where contributions go. Continuity!

District 8: NE Baltimore City/County-Winston

There are 13 active meetings and good participation. As the district rep, he's been visiting all meetings he doesn't normally attend, so he's getting a lot out of the service. He informs groups what the Area does.

We will be having our annual picnic.

District 10: Catonsville, Ellicott City, Columbia – Flemena

The annual picnic will be in May, with AA participation.

District 12: Montgomery Co. Rockville/Gaithersburg - Kathy O. representing in place of Patty S.

There are 18 active groups. Public transportation to Baltimore for the International Convention is much cheaper (\$14). She traveled it herself. So they are encouraging that.

The district is having a hayride in the fall, October 3 or 4th.

[Also sent in from Patty S.- One new group Serenity Ridge AFG that is on Wednesday Nights at 7 pm in Damascus. Address 11215 Bethesda Church Road, Damascus, MD 20872. For the 2018 International we as a District were thinking of renting a bus to transport people too and from the Convention Center. We formed a committee who did extensive research and we found that the best recommendation we made to our groups was public transportation. That is the commuter bus to BWI Airport and Light Rail to the Convention Center. The cost was very reasonable. We are also looking at having another hayride/bonfire this fall.]

District 13: Wheaton/Glenmont and NE of Washington, DC - Suzy

This is her first AWSC meeting. The Spirituality Weekend (last weekend) went very well. All positions in the district are filled. Great dedicated group of people. There are 21 active meetings. They are talking up the International Convention. Logistics were too difficult for organizing transportation because of how the district is geographically. Area Coordinator Reports:

Group Records Coordinator – Maureen M.

Recalculating attendance after lunch: 2 voting members left at lunchtime. Eighteen votes would still be required to pass a motion.

WSO has simplified the Group Records Process- see the new graphic with "Is your meeting information in sync?" WS Office database -> District Reps-> Al-Anon Information Services -> Area Group Records Coordinator

As the GRC, Maureen is the only one who can enter anything in the database. You have to get changes to her about the meetings. It's really easy to search. If you have a meeting that wants to get started you can go into the WSO site and put information in. WSO does the vetting. They need a contact with the CMA (current mailing address). Maureen will get the group number emailed to her. She communicates it to the AIS, district, etc. It's a problem when there are no district representatives for 5 districts. That means there is a hole in the communication process.

If you want to change the time of a meeting, handicapped accessible, etc., contact Maureen.

The GR-1 form has been retired. You can use it if it's easier for you to send information to Maureen or the WSO.

Look at the new directory the WSO website. (There are some anomalies there, related to google and geography.)

At the end of 2017 there were 263 active groups in Area 24.

Archives Coordinator—**Dolores M:** Planning to have an archives display at the International Convention.

Literature Coordinator – Suzanne T: not here

Public Outreach Coordinator – Rita O.

As the new coordinator, Rita made a presentation covering the purpose of Public Outreach, the scope she perceives it to cover, and the short and long-term plans. Rita currently has a committee of 6 people. Martha D. is the co-chair.

The current budget of \$400 was a guess, since not much was done in public outreach during the last three years.

Initially she is focusing on professionals- because most people are referred to Al-Anon by a therapist. She wants to provide information for the newcomer and information about Alateen. She would like to follow-up with the treatment centers, groups like NAMI (National Alliance of Mental Illness) and VA Health. She would like to do a possible email blast to professionals.

WSO does provide a DVD.

Long-term, she is asking for an increase in budget so she can travel around, talk to people, and get to outlying districts. Her committee will need money for office supplies, media, and mailings to professionals. She would like to know how to proceed. It was suggested that a budget increase be voted on at the Assembly.

People had different suggestions for her, including using a low-cost printer in Baltimore, ordering copies of Al-Anon Faces Alcoholism, and other ideas.

Do her plans cover reaching out to the Hispanic market, the blind, or hearing-impaired community?

She would like to do the mailing to professionals, but it does add to the budget. If she had to lose the mailing, she would focus on what she can do through email.

Idalia suggested that she identify the top 3 things that she would like to do? Gil suggested that rather than ask the Assembly for a budget covering the ideal annual plan, to request what would cover the remainder of this year alone. Let Assembly know what you can do this year and the long-term plan for next year.

Rita talked about overcoming problems with professionals: Either they don't know who we are or they have misconceptions (Al-Anon only encourages a hands-off approach, or Al-Anon replaces therapy.)

Alateen Area Process Person – Mike S. (not available in afternoon session)

Alateen Coordinator – acting coordinator Barb M.

Barbara works with Mike. She submitted a handout called "What's Alateen All About".

There are currently 13 meetings in the Area. The goal is to have at least one meeting in each district. Meetings should have the right tent-cards on the meeting table.

Annual training is coming up. An AMIAS is an Al-Anon Member Involved In Alateen Service. They have to be fingerprinted and fingerprinting is paid for by the Area. Mike S. handles all the details.

Al-Anon-Cer Editor - Robert W.

Met with Paul. He is still doing mailings of the Al-Anon-Cer to people who do not want to receive it electronically. Even though he is using Printron, the low-cost commercial printer in Baltimore, the cost is really more than we are asking people to pay for a subscription. But he is not stressing.

Should he be sending out more emails with updates on timely event or information, or just send the Al-Anon-Cer out quarterly? (I think the answer was yes, send out more immediate information in between.)

Webmaster - Katie C.

She did a number of updates in last couple months, including pages regarding the newsletter. They removed identifying information. Main tabs include home, about, meetings and events, resources, alateen, and contact.

List of all the district meetings- Make sure your district meeting information is up-to-date.

Find a Meeting search goes to WSO website now.

She is working with the Technology committee. They might want to add some public outreach.

Alateen has one page, and Alateen has its own website which Mike keeps up-to-date.

Technology Committee Coordinator – Paul C.

He has a committee. They have met once, and have the next 2 meetings scheduled over the next 2 months. They agreed to limit the meetings to 90 minutes, and will meet as many times as necessary to accomplish their goals. Members include Paul C, Connie C, Flemena B, Katie S, Greg M, and Joe I.

They have drafted and approved a Mission Statement:

"To bring Area 24 into the 21st century by using technology to improve communication by:

- Improving access to information
- Facilitating interaction among Area 24 members
- And retaining new members, while maintaining the spirit of the Traditions."

They recognize that fear of technology can exist, and they plan to present short training sessions during Area meetings, as time permits.

Insurance Committee Report — Gil L. Insurance Coordinator

Area provides insurance for any meeting you have, like conventions, workshops, etc. Call Gil for insurance certificate. AISes are not covered. They are an exception.

Baltimore AIS- Diane- new Chairperson of Baltimore AIS, used to be with MaryDelTri. It made sense to become part of Baltimore and they divided the budget too.

There are 3 Alateen meetings, 86 Al-Anon meetings, and a literature depot in the Greater Baltimore Area. They have new meeting directories. They are working on Public Outreach and having the Baltimore AIS Birthday Luncheon (celebrating the beginning of Al-Anon in Baltimore.)

They are looking for tech person for the Baltimore website. The web person does a great job with the front end but is looking for someone to do the back end.

Love gifts for International- Baltimore AIS is working as a collection point.

They will have a June meeting instead of July, because of the International Convention. District reps can bring the Love Mementos to AIS in June.

Mary Del Tri-County AIS – (sounds as if they have disbanded and the Maryland part merged with Baltimore)

Washington DC & Suburban Maryland AIS (DCSMD AIS)- Maureen M.

They have a separate public outreach. Maureen is handling libraries. They exhibit at health fairs and talk to professionals.

The College Park Alateen meeting is struggling.

They are struggling with service at the AIS level. They do not have a chairperson for the Spring Luncheon nor the Fall Workshop. They have a paid part-time worker.

The newsletter goes out sporadically.

On a positive note, they are selling lots of literature. The literature person is very energetic.




